Introduction

- AMSCI is a competition for funding to improve the global competitiveness of England-based manufacturing supply chains as well as attracting new manufacturers to be based in the UK
- Additional funding of £120M was announced in the Autumn Statement to support innovative projects that deliver economic growth

Overview

- Open to all organisations operating as part of a manufacturing supply chain
- Grants and Loans
- Funding available to support projects in the following areas:
 - Capital investment
 - Research and development
 - Skills training

Criteria

- Collaborative, involving two or more organisations
- Seeking at least £2M of support per project
- Commitment from a prime or tier 1 company in their supply chain
- Represent good value for money for the taxpayer

Criteria

- Will result in carbon efficiencies
- Projects support wider Government policy
- Programme Bids:
 - No further competitions
 - Assist SMEs
 - Minimal admin overheads
